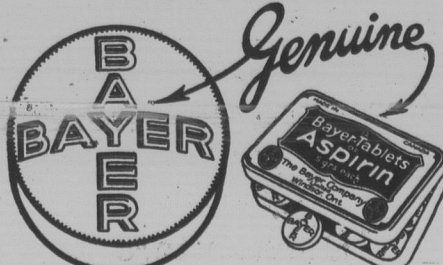

HEADED FOR FREEDOM

TURKISH WOMEN IN REVOLTS AGAINST SOCIAL CUSTOMS.

The Harem Will be a Thing of the Past Before Very Long—Kemal Pasha Has Been Leading the Feminist Movement in His Own Land.

Kemal Pasha is the leading Turkish feminist, but it is predicted that he will have a more difficult task than any he has yet set himself before the freedom he permits and encourages in his wife becomes general among Turkish women. She has assisted in a review of troops, wearing no veil and garbed in riding boots. Such a thing was probably never known in Turkey before of a woman of high caste. It is true that the veil is gradually disappearing, but it is equally true that Turkish women in Constantinople are not allowed to appear in a theatre, restaurant or dancing hall. If one of them dared to do so she would be liable to arrest. Dr. F. Kouph, writing in the New York Herald, says that a short time ago, with a Turkish friend and his wife, who about to enter a hotel for a cup of tea, but was hurriedly barred, and informed that the police prefect had ordered that Turkish women would no longer be permitted to take tea in public places.

How Turkish women are treated by their husbands depends altogether on the husband. The writer says that you may call on a Turkish friend and be at once admitted into the family circle as though in America, and pass the evening playing poker. On the other hand he has a particular friend who is the editor of one of the nationalist papers, and a graduate of Columbia College. They meet frequently, but never yet has he had a glimpse of his friend's wife or even of his mother. On the other hand he has been to the movies with Kemal officers and their sisters and aces the only form of public entertainment that is permitted Turkish women. Even in the movies they are received with reluctance although the Koran says that good women should be sequestered in the home. The theory is that their presence would distract the holy thoughts of the men.

However the harem has practically disappeared. Polygamy is no longer by religion and law but only by custom. Turks are too poor to afford several wives. So the great majority of men but one wife at a time but they are as a rule a rapid succession. The divorce is easier in Turkey than in any other European country. When a man tired of his wife writes her a note telling her to get up and move out. This note is forthwith, and she has no need of an explanation. It is true that the husbands are arranged a little money is fixed which must be paid to the woman if she is repudiated, but it is considered bad form to accept it. But if a woman stays in the house she has almost as much trouble as though she were in England. She can secure her freedom only by leaving her husband and taking with her a divorce law is that she must be a Christian and that she must be a woman of good character. Constantinople is a divorce city several times over. Though the treatment of the wife is not so good as in much eastern Turkey, it is not so bad as in the street to talk to a Christian woman would be checked by her husband's man who saw her. Strongest regulations seek to prevent any kind of intercourse between the sexes. Results in, since the business of Constantinople is practically in the hands of Christians, that there are hardly any Turkish women employed in the offices or stores of the city and hard-up though the Turks are, they are shut out of many of the best-paying jobs of the city.

It is extremely dangerous for a Christian to make love to a Turkish girl. Not long ago a young Armenian, engaged in the process of being arrested and thrown into an Egyptian Scutari, and even Allied reinforcements failed to get him out. He was a Moslem and married the young lady whereupon he was released with the benedictions of his jailers. The modern Turkish woman is freed herself from the long veil, day, if one sees a presumably young and stylishly dressed Turkish lady with a veil, it is safe to say that she is bound on some errand that she wishes to keep from her husband or her father. The revolt of the Turkish women began with the success of the Nationalist movement, and has been proceeding ever since, but it is a long time to go before women in Turkey will be granted full rights as they possess in Christian countries and every religious revival will probably have the effect of postponing the arrival of their complete freedom.

ARMY WORMS HOLD UP OCEAN LIMITED

Pests Swarmed on Rails and Train Could Not Climb Grades.

The Ocean Limited which left here on time Saturday was delayed over two hours between Bathurst and Newcastle by army worms which covered the rails at the up grade going into Gloucester Junction.

All the way between Bathurst and Newcastle these pests gave the train a lot of trouble and especially between Gloucester Jct. and Bathurst where they practically stopped the train and before it could proceed, section men, train hands and a detachment of soldiers who were passengers on the Limited, had to sweep the insects off the rails. Progress naturally was slow as the rails were completely covered with these insects which would swarm back on the rails again almost as fast as they were cleared off. Passengers said they had never before witnessed such a plague of pests. Not only did the caterpillars cover the tracks but they were just as thick on the telegraph poles and fences and the odor from them was most nauseating.

These insects have been giving quite a lot of trouble lately in sections of New Brunswick. Only early last week the train on the Canadian Eastern division of the C. N. R. was held up several hours on the same account and freight trains were also experiencing some difficulty with them in the northern division, the latter part of last week.

California Man Next in Line for Peer's Title—Went Through One Fortune.

San Francisco, June 16—Thirty-one years old, a truck driver one day and English Earl the next, such is the jural jost of fate with Russell S. Houston of Oakland, it was revealed here Friday.

For two years Houston has been a truck driver for the Hogan Transfer Company of Oakland; now he faces they are ahead as the Earl of Covington and heir to a huge fortune, according to notification from Lloyds of London.

BE CAREFUL

Officials of the Forest Service Branch of the Department of Lands and Mines are urging that every precaution be observed to prevent a forest conflagration similar to that of the Miramichi Fire. A carelessly thrown match, cigarette or cigar butt, or live ashes from a pipe may become the cause of a blaze which will sweep the province in its present critical state of drought. Recent fires originating in York County have shown the rapidly with which such a blaze will spread, contrary to the general impression that central and southern New Brunswick has been exempted from the same conditions of drought prevailing in the locality of the most serious fires in the northern portion of the province. At Mactaquack, fire fighters summoned to extinguish a blaze which spread over a mile in an hour, discovered a bait can full of live worms and two fishing rods which had been abandoned in haste. It is believed that this fire spread so rapidly from careless smoking that the parties responsible were unable to retrieve their fishing tackle.

LARGEST ENGINE IN ALL CANADA

Has Just Been Turned Out of Kingston, Ont., Shop for the C. N. R. Rly.

Kingston, Ont.—Designed specially for speed and economy of operation, engine No. 6,000, the largest passenger engine in Canada, has just been built for the Canadian National Railways, by the Canadian Locomotive Company, of Kingston, Ont. The latest iron monster to be added to the 1923 equipment of the National Railways will roll out of the Locomotive Company's yards tomorrow night and make its initial journey to Montreal, where it will be on exhibition over the week end. At the first of the week it will be driven to Toronto, where it will also be on public exhibition.

Engine No. 6,000 is of the Mountain type and, according to both the builders and the engineers of the Canadian National Railways, it is the latest word in engine construction and represents the finest product of modern locomotive design. It is the first sixteen engine which is to be built in Kingston for the National Railways. Of these, six are to be put into operation by the National Railways between Montreal and Toronto, while the remaining ten will be shipped to the Atlantic division, where they will be put into service between Moncton and points eastward.
