THE ESTIMATES SENT IN.

AN AMOUNT OF \$49,221,122 RE- QUIRED FOR THE YEAR.

The Gazette of Election Returns Agents Overhauled in a Feat. Estimated to Canada Temperance Act.

OTTAWA, May 9.—The estimates are down. Sir Charles Tupper laid them out at once to the Committee on Supply. The estimates are for the expenditure for the fiscal year ending on 30th June, 1888. The total amount estimated as necessary during the coming year is \$43,322,386. Of this \$38,941,826 is chargeable to the consolidated fund for current expenditure, and \$7,370,337 is charged to capital account.
