Ald, Lamb seconded the motion, and repeated his objection to a car service via Queen's Park and Avenue-road.

Ald. Burns thought it preferable to

have a line in Avenue-road and thence extend it westward. He added: Ald. McMurrich's proposal includes a route adjoining more vacant lots than the Avenue-road project."
