The first three wickets fell in as many overs, but Hall, opening his account by driving Burns for 4, brought the score up to 22 before he hit to leg at a straight ball. Merritt succumbed to a shorter. Brown was finely caught at long leg. Kirchhoffer missed a break back. Allan ditto, and Macdonell varied the chain of eggs with six. Morrison and Campbell quickly appeared at the wickets on behalf of Toronto. The "phenomenon" was caught in the long field, and Campbell in the slips. Howard ran up 15 quickly. Paton played a ball into his wickets. Burns contributed 21 by pretty, free play, Lindsey a good 8, and Gosling 14, 6 of which were run while Merritt was looking for the ball. I Zingari's second innings produced 74, with 5 men out. Brunel and Macdonell made the chief stand, although Travers got a well-earned 10, and Allan a prettily made 8.
