IT is the intention to have a Canadian representation at the International Exhibition at Antwerp, commencing in May, 1885, and also at the Colonial and Indian Exhibition in London in 1886.

The Government will defray the cost of freight in conveying Canadian Exhibits to Antwerp, and from Antwerp to London, and also of returning them to Canada in the event of their not being said.

All Exhibits for Antwerp should be ready for shipment not later than the first week in Match next. These Exhibitions, it is believed, will afford lavourable opportunity for making known the natural capabilities, and manufacturing and industrial progress of the Dominion.

PUBLIC NOTICE.

A l.l. nersons, including lessers of grazing A lands, are hereby required to take notice that the cutting of timber on the public lands without authority from the Minister of the Interior, or the local Grown Timber Agent of Dominion Lands for the District, is forbidden by law, and all timber so cut without authority is liable to seizure and to be dealt with as the Minister of the Interior may direct.

Each settler on a homestead quarter section not having timber on it, may, on application to the Local Agent of Dominion Lands, purchase a wood lot not execeding twenty acres in extent, at five dollars per nere.

Any person, other than a homestead settler desiring permission to cut timber, must make application therefor to the Minister of the Interior, who will deal with such application according to law.

Persons who have already cut timer without authority, must pay the dues thereon to the Grown Timber Agent at his office, on or before the 1st of May, 1835; otherwise the said timber will be conficeded under the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act.
