On Sunday evening, 25th of September, the Lord Bishop of Nova Scotia preached at St. Mary's Church, Speenhamland, in behalf of King's College. His Lord-ship took for his text. 1 Corinthians, xiii. 13. "And now abideth faith, hope and charity, these three; but

now abide the faith, hope and charity, these three: but the greatest of these is charity."

The Right Reverend Prolate began by reminding his heavers of the true meaning of the word 'charity,' which is 'love, the best, and greatest, and most abiding of all the glts of the Holy Ghost. Having fantfully exhorted them to the spiritual exercise of this most excellent gift if God, he proceeded to apply his subject by planding, in simple and causes of King's College.

This College was founded in the year 1789, and gridewed by the Provincial Legislature with £400 per

This College was founded in the year 1789, and endowed by the Provincial Legislature with £400 per annum from the public funds. In 1802 a Royal charter was granted, conferring the powers and privileges of an university, and from that time until 1836, £1,000 was annually voted by the Imperial Parliament. Notwithstanding the withdrawal of this grant, the college has been enabled, through the exertions of its friends, to continue its course of usufulness and the present to continue its course of usefulness until the present roan, in which it has been deprived by the Provincial Legislature of the £400 formerly granted in perpetuity. The members of the college and other churchmen in Roas Scotia, have already contributed according to their ability, but they are unable to raise the amount required to defray the necessary current expenses of the Institution, since the last act of spoliation. The covernors of the college are, therefore, compelled to appeal to their more favoured brethren in England, to appear to incir more tayoured brethren in England, to enable them to carry on their important work. The renerable Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge his kindly promised to give £1,000, when £2,000 has been obtained from other sources; of this sum not more than half has been raised.
