There is no pretentious claim to generalship or a knowledge of military tactics in which the French officers were fully skilled. The success of her followers in battle lay wholly in the contagion of moral power emanating from her courageous personality which, as Mr. Lowell reminds us, was worth thousands of fighting men. The book is delightful, and its strength and simplicity stimulate the mind wearied with accumulating volumes which talk but do not speak.
