PROTOCOL

RECUEIL DES TRAITES 1944  
TO THE AGREEMENT CONCERNING AN ARMISTICE

Signed at Moscow, October 28, 1944

At the time of the signing of the Armistice Agreement with the Government of Bulgaria, the Allied Governments signatory thereto have agreed to the following:

1. In connection with Article 9 it is understood that the Government of Bulgaria will immediately liquidate the stocks (for the relief of the population) of all products which have suffered as a result of Bulgarian aggression. The quantities of each product to be destroyed will be determined by agreement of the three governments and will be considered as part of the reparation to be made by Bulgaria for loss and damage sustained by Greece and Yugoslavia.

2. The term "war material" in Article 12 shall be deemed to include all material or equipment belonging to, used by, or intended for use by the military or para-military forces of Bulgaria.

3. The use by the Allied (Soviet) High Command of Allied vessels taken over by the Government of Bulgaria in accordance with Article 14 of the armistice and the date of their return to their owners will be the subject of discussion and settlement between the Allied governments concerned and the Government of the Soviet Union.

4. It is understood that in the application of Article 15 the Allied High Command will also arrange for provision of Bulgarian currency, and services, of other kind, to meet the needs of the representatives of the governments of the United States and United Kingdom in Bulgaria.
