#### Canada Urges Signing of Mozambique Peace Accord

Sep 30, 1992, No. 195

The Minister for External Relations and International Development, the Honourable Monique Landry, today called on both parties to the conflict in Mozambique to honour their commitment to sign a peace agreement on October 1 ... " I strongly urge both parties to honour the commitments they made in Rome on August 7 and move quickly toward a peaceful solution to the conflict in Mozambique," said Mrs. Landry.

#### New Foreign Service Institute Inaugurated

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Barbara McDougall, will inaugurate on October 1, the Canadian Foreign Service Institute (CFSI), a new training institution for the Canadian foreign service. "... The Institute will provide training to equip all members of Canada's foreign service with the skills and knowledge necessary to formulate and implement a foreign policy that promotes Canadian interests and values, brings understanding of the world to Canadians, and serves Canadians at home and abroad," said Mrs. McDougall.

#### Zambian Foreign Minister Visits Otlawa

The Honourable Monique Landry announced today that the Zambian Foreign Minister, the Honourable Vernon J. Mwaanga, will visit Ottawa from September 30 to October 3 ... "I am looking forward to meeting with Mr. Mwaanga to reaffirm Canada's support for the fundamental political and economic reforms being implemented in Zambia. We will also review the food and other aid that Canada is providing to Zambia and other Southern African countries, which are being severely affected by the worst drought in decades," said Mrs. Landry.

### Canada Donates Medical Egydpment to Ukraine

Some \$250 000-worth of medical laboratory equipment and supplies were donated today to Children's Hospital #1 in Kiev as a gift from Canada. The presentation was made during a visit to the hospital by the Governor General, His Excellency the Right Honourable Ramon John Hnatyshyn. In addition to today's donation, the project has received \$780 000 support from EAITC's Task Force on Central and Eastern Europe and a one-year supply of basic medicines and supplies from Canada's \$1.5 million humanitarian assistance package to Ukraine.

# Canada Announces 3.7 Million Partners in Progress Initiative with Ukraine

Canadian volunteer advisors for Ukraine's public administration, agriculture and health sectors will be supported under a new two-year, 3.7-million Partners in Progress initiative by the Government of Canada. The announcement was made in an address by the Governor General, His Excellency the Right Honourable Ramon John Hnatyshyn, to the Supreme Rada of Ukraine. "Drawing upon the skills of the nearly one million Canadians of Ukrainian descent, we are working as partners with Ukraine in the critical restructuring of its economic and political systems," noted Mr. Hnatyshyn following his speech.

### ExportVision '92: Bringing Export Opportunities Home

Toronto -- The Honourable Michael Wilson, Minister of Industry, Science and Technology and Minister of International Trade, today announced the launch of ExportVision '92 a cross-country program designed to help Canadian exporters gain new markets for their products and services. "One out of every three Canadian jobs is linked to trade and to successfully export we need to penetrate and develop world markets for our products and services ... ExportVision brings Canada's trade experts together with the experts in business... While these trade agreements [NAFTA and GATT] can help to open doors, it is up to the private sector to step through them, " said Mr. Wilson.

## McDougall Welcomes Talks in South Africa

The Honourable Barbara McDougall, today warmly welcomed the announcement that South African President F. W. de Klerk and African National Congress (ANC) leader Nelson Mandela will meet on September 26 to discuss measures to control the widespread violence in South Africa. "This is a very hopeful first step toward the resumption of multi-party negotiations on a new constitution," said Mrs. McDougall.
