Cultural Activities

Under its support programs, the Multiculturalism Program of the Department of the Secretary of State assists the teaching of Italian in supplementary schools across Canada. It also supported the establishment of an endowed Chair of Italian-Canadian studies at York University, and publications and research projects about Italian emigration/immigration to Canada. Currently, the Program is assisting in the writing of a comprehensive, scholarly history of the Italian community in Canada, by professor R. Harney of the Multicultural History Society of Ontario.

Literary Activities

Under its Writing and Publications Program, the Multiculturalism Program of the Department of the Secretary of State assisted in the funding of the first national conference of Italian-Canadian writers in Vancouver in 1986. The conference, "Italian Canadian Writing in Transition: From Yesterday to Tomorrow" was organized by the Italian Cultural Centre.

The Multiculturalism Program has also provided funding to the following literary undertakings:
