It is bisected by the Canadian National Railways. It belongs properly with the riding of Lake Centre rather than with that of Rosetown-Biggar, where it has been placed under the schedule. Therefore I move:

That the schedule for Saskatchewan be amended as follows:

"That townships 21 to 30 inclusive in range 28, west of the second meridian, and townships 22 to 30 inclusive in range 1, west of the third meridian, be removed from Rosetown-Biggar and added to Moose Jaw-Lake Centre.'
