POLLUTION-ESQUIMALT HARBOUR

Question No. 421-Mr. Anderson:

1. Are Canadian naval vessels stationed in Esquimalt dumping untreated sewage into the Harbour and, if so, which ones?

2. Have any measures been taken by the Department of National Defence during the past year to prevent the discharge of untreated sewage by *HMCS Dockyard* into Esquimalt Harbour?

Hon. Donald S. Macdonald (Minister of National Defence): 1. Yes, HMCS Qu'Appelle, Yukon, St. Croix, Gatineau, Cape Breton, Columbia, Chaudiere, Cowichan, Miramichi, Fundy, Chignecto; Two Gate Vessels (Porte de la Reine and Porte de Quebec) and the sailing yacht Oriole.

2. At the present time a comprehensive study is under way in conjunction with the Municipality which proposes a connection to the Municipal Collection System discharging to the Macaulay Point Outfall for final disposal into the ocean. Design is now complete for the new Dockyard and sewage interceptor system, and design is under way for the new Naden and Graving Dock sewage interceptor system.

ARMED FORCES-EDUCATION OF DEPENDANTS OVERSEAS

Question No. 443-Mr. Anderson:

Are all schools run by the Canadian Armed Forces in Germany using the same course credit system and, if not, for what reason is this practice not followed?

Hon. Donald S. Macdonald (Minister of National Defence): Yes, all secondary schools or combined schools at the secondary level adopted the credit system effective September 1, 1970. The extent of application may vary depend ng on the size of the school, grade level structures, physical facilities and pupil involvement. At the elementary level pupils are classified by grades where instruction is encouraged on an individual or group basis to meet the particular needs of the pupil.

NATIONAL DEFENCE—REPLACEMENT FOR ARGUS AIRCRAFT
