fall on you and converse with you what
may be done with my son & with Gaston de
Lévis during the period between their leaving
at Montreal & their joining ^{McGill} ~~McGill~~
College in September. - He also said he would
try & find out how my son might earn
some money by teaching, so as to increase
the allowance I am in a position to give
him, which as a matter of fact is not very
high owing to the destruction of my estate
by the Germans & by the war. - He intended
to talk over that question with you. -

Before closing this letter I wish to let you
know that my eldest daughter has got
engaged to Captain Vicomte de Tarragon, who
behaved most gallantly during the war, and has
just left the "Ecole Supérieure de Guerre". - He is an
Infantry officer, & his father retired at the end of the
war as a Cavalry Colonel. - The wedding will take
place by January 15th, and Marshal Doffe will be my
daughter's "témoin". -
