Reciprocal Interchange.

At a meeting of my Committee held on 10th instant, reports were submitted with regard to the scheme of reciprocal interchange of teachers, and particularly to the work now being undertaken by Mr. MacOdrum and Mr. D.L. Gower.

After reviewing the work on which these two gentlemen were engaged, it was resolved to recommend as follows:-

- (1) That, in view of the nature of the investigations undertaken by Mr. MacOdrum, his studentship be extended to cover Session 1926-27, two Sessions being considered the minimum time for the effective pursuance of the line of study on which he is engaged, the recommendation being made subject to the approval of the authorities of McGill University.
- (2) That further reports be received on the work of Mr. Gower at McGill University, and if it be found that Mr. Gower's line of study necessitates two Sessions, as in the case of Mr. MacOdrum, the same privilege be extended to Mr. Gower as to Mr. MacOdrum.

I shall be glad to learn whether you would be agreeable to the continuance of Mr. MacOdrum's studies for another Session at Glasgow, and whether also you consider that Mr. Gower ought to have a second year with you at McGill University.

The emoluments to be paid to both would be the same for Session 1926-27 as for the present Session, viz., £250, but there would be no necessity for the payment of a further sum of £50 for travelling expenses.
