Re BAR CURRICULUM CHANGES--

Dear Mr. Principal:-

Powers of
the General
Council.

Under the Bar Act of the Province of Quebec a candidate for admission to the Bar must study as clerk or student with a practising advocate during at least four consecutive and entire years. This period is reduced to three years for students attending a "regular course of law" in a university of this province and to one year for those who have previously successfully completed such a law course. The General Council may from time to time determine the subjects which shall be studied and the number of lectures upon each subject in universities and colleges which must be attended to constitute a regular law course availing only if the said curriculum shall have been effectually followed by the university and the candidate.
