

THE COLLEGIATE INSTITUTE.

Prospectus.

THE system of education commencing with the Fourth Form of the Public School Course comprises Classics (Latin and Greek), Mathematics, (Arithmetic, Algebra, Euclid, Trigonometry, Conic Sections, and Natural Philosophy,) Modern Languages, (English, French and German,) Physical Sciences, (Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Physiology,) Ancient and Modern History, and Geography; Writing, Drawing, Music; Military Drill and Calisthenics, and affords a complete preparation for the Universities, the learned Professions, the various Branches of the Civil and of the Military Service and Commercial Life.

Eight sessions or four scholastic years are required to complete the course.

Classes are maintained exclusively

FOR SENIOR MATRICULATION IN THE UNIVERSITY,
FOR FIRST CLASS TEACHERS, and
FOR JUNIOR MATRICULATION.

There are also classes

FOR INTERMEDIATE CANDIDATES, and
FOR SECOND CLASS CERTIFICATES.

N. B.—Calisthenics, Water Color Drawing and Oil Painting, and Phonography are taught at a small extra charge.
