

lick a more minute and early account of those which were ruin'd in East-Frizeland, amounting to upwards of two millions of rations. Notwithstanding which, the London gazette firmly and positively denied the truth of that relation, and affirm'd that the loss of their magazines in Westphalia and East-Frizeland was greatly exaggerated, nothing being more certain that the Allies had little of consequence in those parts.

*December 26.* The French frigate *Hermione*, of 36 guns, was lost on the bar of Vigo.

*December 27.* The *Boulogne* of 20 guns 140 men, M. de St. Romain commander, bound from the Isle of Bourbon to Port L'Orient, laden with coffee and pepper, and valued at 40,000 pounds, was taken by the *Venus* Captain Harrison.

*December 30.* The *Biddeford* of 24 guns Captain Gordon, was lost off the Yarmouth sands. Out of 160 men, only the Lieutenant, Master, Surgeon, Lieutenant of the Marines, and about 70 private men were saved.
