Martinico, Guadalupe, Marigalante, and St. Lucia, to be reftored to the French.—Tobago and the reft of the neutral islands to be ceded to Great-Britain.

The importance of Martinico will be feen by its produce. It makes annually about forty thoushand hogsheads of white sugar, and ten thousand of brown, prodigious quantities of coffee, cocoa, and a good deal of cotton: it has an excellent harbour, to which all fhips repair in the hurricane St. Pierre is a very populous, large, feason. and well-built town; here it is that the produce of the French Windward Islands centers, and from whence they are all furnished with European goods, as well as the four Neutral Islands. This island has ever been the terror of Barbadoes, Antigua, St. Kitt's, Nevis, and Montferrat; and, if restored, will bring us again in a future war.

Guadalupe is extremely fruitful, and capable of very great improvement; has a pretty good harbour at Point Petre, and has at prefent about feventy thoufand negroes: it is in fight of Antigua and Monferrat, to windward of them, and not above twelve leagues diffance. The great wealth of it at the time we took it was unknown,
