TERRIBLE RAVAGES OF WHITE PLAGUE IN BELGIUM. Is Most Menacing of Many Evils
Threatening Future of Belgium.

The most menacing of the many evils brought upon Belgium by the war is the rapid increase in the nummainutrition and exposure to a physical condition, in virtue of which it becomes an easy prey to the disease. This is particularly the case among the children of the cities and crowded it dustrial, centres, many of whom are in the incipient stages of consumption.

A type of organization existing before the war has been amplified and transformed, and is now effectively combating this menace to Belgium's next generation. With the support of the fielgian relief commission it was possible to remodel what has been known as the "Foyer des Orphelins," a society having for its purpose the advancement of the physical and moral welfare of orphans, ehandoned or abused children into the orphanages and anti-tuberculosis league. The organization is now directing its energies to protecting the young from the disease and to restoring, where possible, those already affected.

The many institutions under the direction of this organization are largely dependent upon the Belgian relief commission for the money wherewith to continue their great work Many have reached the limit of their accommodations and their resources, and it is hard to accept such limitations when there are so many more children in dire need of attention. To carry on and increase this work of salvation outside aid is absolutely indispensable, and the only channel thru which such aid may be secured is the Belgian relief fund.
