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Slap at American Managers.
London, Sept. 12.—The disposition to spoil American theatrical productions by organized noise is becoming increasingly evident since the clamor in the gallery at the production of "The Wizard of the Town," by George H. LOSS HALF A MILLION.
New York, Sept. 12.—Fire broke out late last night in the cotton storage warehouse owned by the New York Storage Company in Brooklyn, and caused damage to the amount of \$500,000. The fire was burning fiercely at 8 o'clock, but the firemen eventually succeeded in subduing it. The building, which was three hundred feet long, is divided into three compartments, each separated by a thick fire wall. The compartment in which the fire originated, to which it was confined, contained 30,000 bales of cotton.

MADE CHUGO CIGAR LABELS.
Chicago, Sept. 12.—Secret service men in this city believe they have unearthed a significant evidence in the making of counterfeit cigar labels. It is said that the counterfeiters have been operating in the city for some time, and have been making labels for the famous "Made Chugo" cigars. The information leading to the investigation was given to the government officials by members of the International Cigar-makers' Union. It is said that sufficient evidence has been secured to warrant the arrest of eleven persons, who will be taken into custody today or to-morrow.

CHICAGO LIMITED WRECKED.
Syracuse, N.Y., Sept. 12.—The Chicago Limited on the West Shore Railroad, west-bound, was wrecked at Eastwood, three miles east of this city, early this morning. The engineer failing to see the signal to stop at an open switch. The locomotive, baggage car and three coaches left the track and overturned. The four railmen cars remained on the track. No one was seriously hurt.

Deaths From Smallpox.
Yesterday afternoon the Provincial Health Department received a statement which showed the number of deaths from smallpox during the month of July last in New York City to be 107 and in New York State 109. In the Province of Ontario, since the first of the year, there have been only about 10 deaths from the disease, and in the Province of Quebec there have been only about 10 deaths from the disease. The smallpox epidemic in Ontario is a mild type.
