INQUEST MAY RESUME BEHIND LOCKED DOORS

Miss Kinrade May Be Allowed to Give Evidence in Camera—Hope of Resuming To-Night.

HAMILTON, April 28.—(Special.)—The coroner's inquest into the death of Miss Kinrade is expected to resume to-night behind closed doors. The coroner is expected to allow Miss Kinrade to give evidence in camera.
