Not only is there a falling off in net profits, but the cheque payable to the city, after setting aside \$10,000 for exhibition office expenses, the usual custom, is a little over \$12,000 less than the estimated

.The decrease is due to the fact that, while gross receipts increased about 61/2 per cent. expenses increased about 1314 per cent. The figures are:-
