The meeting was attended by representatives of every club in the league.

The Western Leaguers decided not to express any opinion as a body, on proposals for redistricting minor leagues, until the matter should have been brought befors the National Association. Several of them did, however, as individuals, exprers themselves as favoring some move which would strengthen minor leagues to meet the stress of war conditions.
