Ottawa, Dec. 16-The food controller has issued regulations governing the trade in cereals in packages of less than twenty pounds of weight. They provide ly?" twenty pounds of weight. I, no manufacture of breakfast foods or cereals shall manufacture, for sale in Canada, or sell in Canada, such breakfast foods or cereals in original packages of less than twenty pounds without first obtaining a license from the food controller for each kind of breakfast food or cereal manufactured. License fees ranging from \$120

factured. License fees ranging from \$120 upwards are to be charged.

Wholesale and retail dealers will not be required to secure a license for the sale of breakfast foods or cereals manufactured under license from the food

Dreakfast flood of cereal method flour or any product of wheat are subject to cancellation by the food controller upon one month's notice if, in his opinion, it is desirable to conserve the wheat or product of wheat so used.
