CEYLON TROUBLE OVER RELIGION

Facts About Recent Riots—Turks Sink British Steamship in Suez Canal

Some weeks ago a Times' despatch told of an uprising in Ceylon. The Boston Globe says:

Religious riots in Ceylon were responsible for a delay in loading the British steamship Clan Farquhar, which arrived last night with a valuable cargo of Oriental products for Boston and New York importers.

When the steamship reached Colombo from Calcutta, the streets were filled with fighting natives. The Singapore tried to drive the Moors from the country, and the latter fought with great bravery in defending themselves.

Rioting became so general that the lives of Europeans were in danger, and volunteers were called to protect property. Merchants and clerks were hastily drilled and prepared to defend themselves, but the native soldiers, after 10 days of fighting, in which hundreds of Moors and Singalese were killed, succeeded in restoring order.

During the trouble business was at a standstill. The British mine was a session of howling mobs. No work was done on the piers, and the Clan Farquhar and several other freighters had to wait until the trouble was quieted before they were loaded.

The Clan Farquhar loaded part of her cargo at Calcutta and then went to Ceylon to finish. After leaving the latter port on June 12 the steamship encountered terrific southwesterly monsoons. On reaching Suez she was delayed thirty hours by the sinking of the British steamship Telexias in the canal.

The first news of the blowing up of the steamship by a Turkish mine was brought here last week by the captain of the steamship, Rufford Hall. According to Capt. McPherson of the Clan Farquhar, the Telexias was very badly damaged.
