

It is a practice trench "Somewhere in Scot," and the young men seen within it are members of the Officers' Training Corps of the 18th Service Batt, High-Light Infantry. The picture gives an idea of the practical though arduous work required in training the recruits. The prospective officers of the battalion receive a course of training which includes musketry, two-hour lectures actics, organization, topography, etc., and administration. The course also includes five days devoted to the constructor of earthworks, and real "hiking" in the country about Glasgow.


