Brigade Captain Injured in Attempting to Rescue Comrade.

HALIFAX, N. S., Feb. 14-One fireman died from suffo-cation, another was severely injured and damage estimated at about \$150,000 was caused when a spectacular fire this morning completely destroyed Ben's Bakery on Shirley street.
The badly injured man was Fire Captain Harber, who received serious injuries while at-
