

He is a Sailor First, Says Carn

Conrad as He Reaches
New York.

New York, May 7.—Saying that writing was "a terrible grind" and that he was a sailor first and last, Joseph Conrad, one of the world's foremost authors of sea tales, arrived here recently on the Tuscania of the Anchor line on his first visit to the United States. While at quarantine he seemed more interested in a little three-masted schooner which crossed the bow of the Tuscania than the vista of Manhattan's sky line.

Mr. Courad said he had spent most of his time on the bridge with Capt. Bone commander of the Tuscania, who is also an author. He remarked that the Tuscania was the largest ship he had ever traveled on, although he had roved the seas the greater part of his life. In his interview Mr. Conrad made clear that he does not regard himself as a litterateur. He admitted that he knew little about modern American fiction.

"I have not read much fiction, al-

that he knew little about modern American fiction.

"I have not read much fiction, although, of course, I know the outstanding men," he said. "My life is not a literary one; 20 years at sea does not form a literary mind. I was a seaman and never anything else. I find it a frightful grind."

In answer to a question, Mr. Conrad said that his favorite of the books he had written was "It Depends on the Day," adding that to him his books were like children in a family—"you like one better than the others some days but love them all."
