THE VALLEY RAILWAY

The St. John Valley Railway will be completed by the contractors so as to hand over to the Dominion government for operation as part of the Canadian National Railways before August 1, 1919, the date which was some time ago named, according to a statement by Hon. W. P. Jones, president of the St. John and Quebec Railway Company, the representatives of the New Brunswick government in the construction of the road.

Whether the Dominion government will be ready to take the road over for operation before August 1 was something Hon. Mr. Jones did not know, but he said that late reports indicated the railway would be ready for operation over its entire length from Centreville to Westfield before the end of the month. This will give the Canadian National Railways entrance to St. John for their short line from the west via the Transcontinental Railway route.

NOTED PHYSICIAN DEAD

Dr. Abraham Jacob, one of the foremost physicians in the United States died late on Thursday night at his summer home on Lake George. He was eighty-nine years old.

Dr. Jacob, who was educated in Germany, but who had received honorary degrees from the University of Michigan, Columbia, Yale, Harvard and Jefferson, became identified with the German revolutionary movement and was "in detention" in Berlin and Cologne from 1851 to 1853 on high treason charges. On his release he moved to New York and began practice, specializing in diseases of children. He was professor of diseases of children at the College of Physicians and Surgeons, 1870 to 1893 when he was made professor emeritus. He had held many important hospital appointments.
