Teach them first of all to make jam and jelly. For currant jelly boil four pounds of currant juice without the sugar for ten minutes, or until the quantity is reduced. Heat the sugar in the oven and add when very hot to the liquid, so that the temperature will not be greatly reduced. When all is dissolved, bring to a boil again and continue from three to five minutes. Test, and when done, remove and put away in unsealed jars. When cool , seal with melted paraffin.
