French War Office Tells of Some Progress---Reports That Russians Have Upper Hand in Poland Persist

Paris, Nov. 30 (3 p. m.)—The French official communication given out in Paris this afternoon is as follows:— "In Belgium the enemy is remaining on the defensive. The artillery fire has been feeble, and we have made progress at certain points. In the vicinity of Fay we hold securely the positions we occupied on November 28. "In the region of Solssons there has been intermittent artillery fire direct-ed against the town.

"In the Argonne several attacks on the town of Dagatelle were repu by our troops

There has been a heavy fog oh the heights of the Meuse. In the Woevre district the enemy bombarded the forest of Agreen without result.

There is nothing to report in the Vosges."
