

## FFORT TO COMBAT CHILD DRINKING IN GERMANY

Berlin, April 25—Under the protectorate of the imperial chancellor, the first German congress for the non-alcoholic upbringing of children was held in this city. This clumsy title concealed what is described as a national tragedy—the extent to which all classes of the community allow their children from earliest years to take alcohol.

Dr. Von Strauss, president of the first administrative court, says:— "Babies are given schnaps and children not yet ready, for school take bottles of beer with them to the playground. The majority of German school children, boys and girls, in all classes receive alcoholic drinks, and when past their twelfth year they partake, as a matter of course, in the habits of their parents—'mornings after' are nowise uncommon among children, and there is a deep-rooted theory that beer, wine, and schnaps do children no harm."

The congress was demonstrated by scientific descriptions, by tabular proofs, and by the weight of the authority of the foremost scientists in Germany the disast trous extent of this belief.
