ART DEPARTMENT. Sackville, May 29.—Perhaps never before has the exhibit of the work of the Mount Allison Art Department attracted such attention as the display of students' work in the Owens' Art Gallery has been attracting during the present closing week. This fact is not surprising, as the showing of paintings, drawings, pieces of china, bits of leather and metal work, the specimens of designing, wood carving, etc., is easily the most artistic that has ever been made here.

Prominent among the pieces of work shown are products of the skill of the three young ladies who this year graduated from the Art department - Misses Christian Harris, of Pictou, N. S.; Katherine Ryan, of Sackville, and Lila Elizabeth Chase, of Port Williams, N. S. Misses Harris and Ryan will graduate this evening in drawing, and Miss Chase in painting. Miss Chase exhibits a number of paintings. Prominent among them is a Candle Light Study, in which the light effect is brought out in a truly charming way. Miss Chase is also exhibiting several miniatures, a well executed portrait in oils, a landscape sketch and a striking painting of yellow roses, as well as some studies in pencil.

Miss Ryan's work shows splendid technique as well as freedom of movement. Her drawing of Venus has been much admired by many.
