S. of the late Robert Shand Caie, by his wife, Isabella Low, who emigrated to N.B. from Aberdeen, Scot. B. in Nairn, Scot., 18 Aug., 1814. Sat in Miramichi. M., in Halifax, N.S., 1840, Miss Isabella Trider. Is a merchant and shipper of
