	Sun. Oct. 12/41.		Protestant and R.C. Church Parades very well attended.	
	Mon. Oct. 13/41.		A meeting of the Officer's Mess was held, and mess rules were formally adopted. As a result of the report, the extra messing fees were cut in half. A new stove arrived for use in the Airmen's Mess. The Officers meeting was followed by a Thanksgiving Dinner. The new guard house at the main gate was taken over by the Service Police.
