Le Droit, of Sept. 10th, quoting extensively and approvingly from Le Devoir's views on the functions of the Governor-General, emphasizes the opinion that as Canada is no longer a colony, her complete autonomy should be respected. A Governor-General should never, either consciously or unconsciously, allow any outside interest to interfere in his conception of Canada's needs.
