Confirming our telephone conversation of this morning
re the above noted subject matter, I wish to advise as follows:

The Department is prepared to approve the renewal of the
above Licence at the following rates:

| Fir and Cedar all grades: | \$3.50 per M. |
| Hemlock & Balsam all grades. | 2.25 " |
| Alder and Maple all grades. | 2.50 " |

There will also be a charge of 20¢ per acre ground rental
on a minimum of 750 acres, but this may be increased to take in the total
acreage of the south part of the reserve, owing to the fact that there are
small pockets of timber all over it and consequently it would be next to
impossible to define where these pockets are. Furthermore in the logging
operations of these pockets it is reasonable to expect that other parts of
the reserve will also be used to get the logs to the water or other means
of transportation. Regarding the areas which the Indians claim to be
reserved, this has not yet been cleared up to our satisfaction.

Should you wish to remit Renewal of Licence fee of \$2.00
plus \$150.00 covering ground rental on the 750 acres at the time you return
the completed copies of the new Timber Licence, and which you will receive
in a short time, it will be appreciated.
