## SYNOPSIS OF REQUIREMENTS.

For the information of those who are not acquainted with the requirements necessary for registration as medical practitioners in this Province, the following synopsis is given:

- 1. Section 29 of the Consolidated Statutes of British Columbia provides: "The Council shall admit upon the register any person who shall produce from any college or school of medicine or surgery, requiring a three years' course of study, a diploma of qualification: provided, also, that the applicant shall furnish to the Council satisfactory evidence of identification, and pass before the members thereof, or such of them as may be appointed for the purpose, a satisfactory examination touching his fitness and capacity to practice as a physician and surgeon." 1886, c. 13, s. 28.
- 2. Section 2 of the "Medical Act, Amendment Act, 1893," provides that: "The Council shall admit upon the register every person mentioned in chapter 48 of the Acts of Parliament of the United Kingdom, passed in the 49th and 50th years of Her Majesty's reign, duly registered under the "Medical Act," (Imperial), prior to and inclusive of the 30th day of June, 1887, upon complying with the orders, regulations or by-laws of the Council and giving due proof of such registration, and that the person applying for registration has not lost the benefit of same by reason of misconduct or otherwise, and upon payment of the fees fixed by the Council, not to exceed one hundred dollars."
