(William Briggs, Toronto, 352 pages, \$1.25). It is a tale of the Welsh coast, fresh and wholesome, with the happy ending which story readers so dearly love.

Four new volumes of poetry in a single announcement of a Canadian publisher, is evidence that the "gentle art" is not being altogether overlooked in the rush and crush of the swift material development of this new country. William Briggs has on the press, and shortly to appear, Ballads of a Cheehako by R. W. Service, the author of Songs of a Sourdough. A sourdough, by the way, is the far north name for an old-timer; a cheehako is the euphonious designation of a "tenderfoot" or newcomer. Mr. Service's first volume has had an extraordinary popularity, which bodes well for the success of this new one. W. M. MacKerracher's, Canada, My Land, and Other Poems, issued a few months ago, was warmly received. His Sonnets and Other Verses, about to appear, will likely add to his reputation. Donald A. Fraser is another young writer, who has a promising future before him. His forthcoming volume, Pebbles and Shells, will gather up in book form a collection of his verses which have appeared in East and West and other papers and magazines.

Additional promising titles from William Briggs are Three Premiers of Nova Scotia (Johnstone, Howe, and Tupper), by Dr. Edward Manning Saunders, father of the well-known Canadian writer, Marshall Saunders; a new book entitled The Second

Chance, by Nellie L. McClung, the author of the exceedingly popular Sowing Seeds in Danny; The People of the Plains, a beautifully illustrated book on the Canadian West, by Amelia M. Paget; and The Canadian Apple Grower's Guide, by Linus Wolverton, the horticultural expert and authority.

An interesting addition to Sunday School Teacher Training Handbooks, is the Convention Normal Manual for Sunday School Workers, just issued by the Sunday School Board of the Southern Baptist Convention, (Nashville, Tenn., 220 pages, cloth 50c., paper 35c.). Dr. Frost, the publisher, is a thoroughly practical man, and his writers, Mr. Spilman, on Sunday School Method and History; Leavell, on The Pupil and His Needs; and Hight C. Moore, on The Books of the Bible; are competent teachers and writers, fully alive to the needs of the average young person who is preparing to be a Sunday School teacher, or who, being already a teacher, wants to fit himself for more effective work. The users of our own Teacher Training Handbooks may get many valuable sidelights from the Convention Normal Man-

The Supplemental Lessons for the Sunday School, also issued by the Southern Baptist Board, embody a very well thought out and wrought out scheme of instruction, embodying Bible Verses, Catechism, Bible Geography, the Books of the Bible, etc. They appear in the form of separate, well bound little booklets at 5c. each, for the various Grades from the Beginners upward.
