CASUAL REVENUE ACCOUNTS.

FREDERICTON, 12th MARCH 1833.

MR. PARTELOW from the Committee to whom were referred the Casual Revenue Accounts for 1832, sent down to the House of Assembly by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, submitted the following Report:—
