A PARALLEL MARKET CASE
The Courier has from the first extended that the Ontario Legislature would not sanction the removal of the present market site, because was decided as such in perpetuity similar case has occurred in Toronto and here is the report from the Toronto Globe—

"St. Patrick's Market, aged sixty-six, is to stay. The city's attempt to get permission to use an old landmark for other than market purposes failed, and civic
