FREEDOM OF SEAS FOR MERCY SHIPS

Safe Passage is Allowed Vessels for Belgian Relief

SUBMARINE CAMPAIGN
And Floating Mines Do Not Hamper Good Work

Up from the South Atlantic, or across the ocean from Canadian and American ports, up through the English Channel, or riding down the North Sea, a certain flood of vessels go about their business, although submarines, floating mines, torpedoes, were mythical, and did not exist, or were not to be feared if they did.

They are the Relief boats, bound for Rotterdam, carrying food to Belgium, their mission: to save a nation. On the high seas it has become a custom on the part of neutral and British ships to stop their engines when the coast or pass, or are passed by one of these Ships of Mercy, thus to acknowledge the splendid work upon which it is engaged.

Even the patrol boats around the British shores, those little wasps that have stung to death so many venomous submarines, come spinning over the waves at sight of a Relief boat, and salute her with as much importance as a dreadnought.

And the German subs are under strict orders to give every Relief boat the freedom of the seas—absolute guarantees to this effect have been given by the German Government to the Relief Commission.

It remains, therefore, only to fill these ships with flour and beans and corn to ensure that Belgium shall not starve, for the Relief Commission is distributing its supplies to-day just as effectively as the German department of the Royal Museum. They are to be released on one of the larger islands in the Stockholm Archipelago. It is intended later to attempt hybridization with native cattle. These are the first bison ever seen in Sweden.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS
The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.
Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre.
Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homesteaded land, also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homesteaded land on certain conditions.
A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.
Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.
