

Excursion to Forty-Mile. The first excursion of the season on the Yukon river will be given on Sunday and promises to be a grand success.

The carrying capacity of the steamer is 100 passengers but in order to insure the comfort of their patrons the gentlemen who have chartered the boat will limit the number to 50.

A full string orchestra and brass band will be carried and the excursionists will be regaled with fine music to their heart's content.
