WASHINGTON, June 25—More than a million men have volunteered in the American army and navy during the period of les than three months that period of les than three months that has elapsed since war was declared to exist. The arrays, navy and national guard represented an aggregate strength of little more than 300,000 men when the war resolution was adopted. Today between 700,000 and 800,000 are enrolled in the various branches of the fighting service and the great majority of them are armed, equipped and under training.
