SCOUNDRELS AND DOGS.

STRONG LANGUAGE USED IN THE GERMAN REICHSTAG. The Majority Trying to Wear Out the Obstructionists by Holding Long Sessions.

Berlin, Dec. 5.--With the exception of a two-hour recess for supper the Reichstag was in continuous session from 10 a.m. until half-past 11 o'clock last night, this being the longest session in the history of the Reichstag. Most of the time was spent in listening to the report of the Tariff Committee, but considerable rough talk was indulged in tonight. The members called each other "scoundrels," "dogs," etc. The House, 77 in the motion of the President, forbade the Socialist Warm to speak, because the latter insisted on talking on the water and gas questions, instead of confining his remarks to the paragraph of the bill concerning minerals and raw materials, which was under discussion. The majority is determined to wear out the obstructionists by long sessions, the special motive for holding a session to-night being to prevent the Socialist members from speaking at 37 mass meetings in Berlin and the suburbs, held for the purpose of expressing indignation at the method of rushing through the tariff. The members of the majority and the newspapers show much apprehension regarding the political capital that the Socialists are making out of the wrangles in the Reichstag. The mass meetings to-night were attended by many thousands of persons and were generally of an orderly character.

A Mild Sensation. London, Dec. 5.--While speaking on the education bill in the House of Lords last night the aged Archbishop of Canterbury almost fainted, fell back in his seat, and had to be carried out. The incident created a mild sensation. It will be remembered that the Archbishop had a similar seizure during the coronation service in Westminster Abbey on August 9, just after he had placed the crown upon King Edward's head.
