GENERAL NEWS

The New Brunswick Hydro Electrical Power Company are seeking incorporation to develop water powers in the province and for the supply of electric power to St. John and other points.

A delegation from the New Brunswick Forest, Fish and Game Association who waited on Premier Hazen received his assurance that he would support the proposed legislation.

Miss Carrie Nation of "Hatch" fame is visiting at the sanatorium at Leavenworth, Kan.

Reports of a number of shipping disasters received as the result of a gale in the North Sea, which swept the eastern coast of England.

Robert E. Davis the missing Boston broker who is charged with embezzlement was arrested in Rio Janeiro. He will waive extradition saying he can prove the missing securities were lost in speculation.

Belleville temperance workers have decided to ask the City Council to submit a local option by law next January.

A number of disturbances in Paris and Madrid followed the appearance of the new harem skirt, the wearers being mobbed and pelted with eggs by the angry crowds.

Florence Bird 18 years of age, died under the influence of chloroform while in the office of a dentist in Montreal. The coroner found that all necessary precautions had been taken.

A crusade has been started in Montreal by the W. C. T. U. for the purpose of abolishing the Grocery Liquor License. It is proposed to enlist every organization in the province and to make the campaign entirely a woman's affair.

Under the compulsory law in Australia 125,000 lads have registered for army training. The response shown by the youths of the Federation has been marvellous.

The Montreal Star says that the Dominion Government have decided to stop the immigration of negroes from the United States, a party being stopped at the boundary on their way to Western Canada.

Owing to the amount of sickness in Ottawa during the typhoid outbreak, Archbishop Gauthier has announced that Roman Catholics will not be under the usual obligation to fast during the Lenten season.

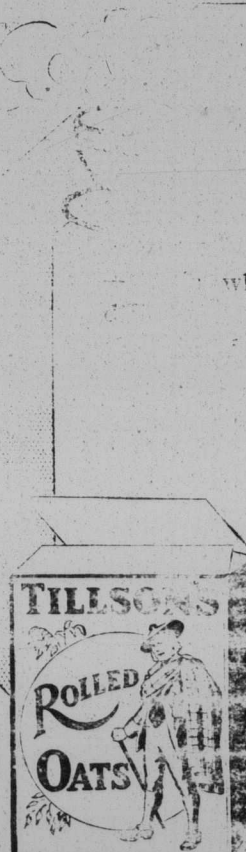
A bill prohibiting the manufacture and sale of cigarettes passed the lower house of Salt Lake City Legislature lately, and the friends of the measure say it will pass the Senate.

Cod Liver Oil is now being supplied to ailing and necessitous school children in London under the Provision of Meals Act. Other children who seem weakly are given a meal of milk and bread or biscuit at play time.

Damage to the extent of nearly \$60,000 was caused by a fire in St. Antoine Street, Montreal last week. The building was completely gutted many fine automobiles stored there being destroyed.

The Norwegian cabinet has adopted a resolution providing for the admission of women to all state offices except those having to do with the cabinet, and the military, diplomatic and consular services and the church.

Sackville Board of Trade discussed the question of the Mail order business and came to the conclusion that more advertising in the local paper would meet to a certain extent the competition, but frequently the merchant who takes a small space in the local publication, or perhaps may not advertise at all thinks that the newspaper should fight the merchant's battle against the mail order house.
