SLASHED HIMSELF WITH RAZOR

Coroner Believes That is How Man Whose Body Was Found, Met His Death.

NIAGARA FALLS, June 23.—The body of the man whose name is supposed to be Wick Tamba and who may have come here from Yonkers was found between the tracks of the gorge railway about 300 feet north of the whirlpool rapids station yesterday afternoon at 3 o'clock. Dr. W. L. Draper, coroner, believes the man tried to commit suicide with a safety razor blade, lost his nerve and jumped over the bank. There is a sheer drop of 160 feet at the point. Elmer Hasley, a motorman on a gorge route car, saw the body. He notified Superintendent William Piper and the body was brought by an Express car to Second street and Walnut avenue. There it was met by Coroner Draper and the police patrol and taken to the Leupie morgue. Dr. Draper found that the man's right leg was broken that there was a cut on the face, extending clear around the jaw and two long slashes on the left wrist. A safety razor wrapper was found on the body.

SHARP CLASH ONE DEAD

Civilian Dead, Several Wounded Including Police in Winnipeg.

WINNIPEG, June 23.—One man is dead and nearly forty are wounded as a result of a clash here Saturday afternoon between a mob on Main street and the Royal Northwest Mounted Police. Mike Socolowski, registered alien, was shot through the heart. Robert C. Johnson, a returned soldier, received bullets through the left thigh and right knee and Jack Barrett was shot through the thigh. Both these men will recover. Sixteen police were injured, one seriously. A young man named Williams was fatally crushed when a land roller, from which he was thrown, passed over him, on a farm near Vernon, Ont., Friday.
