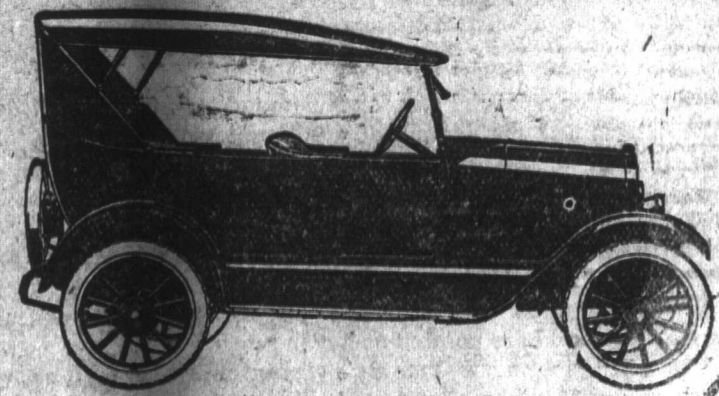

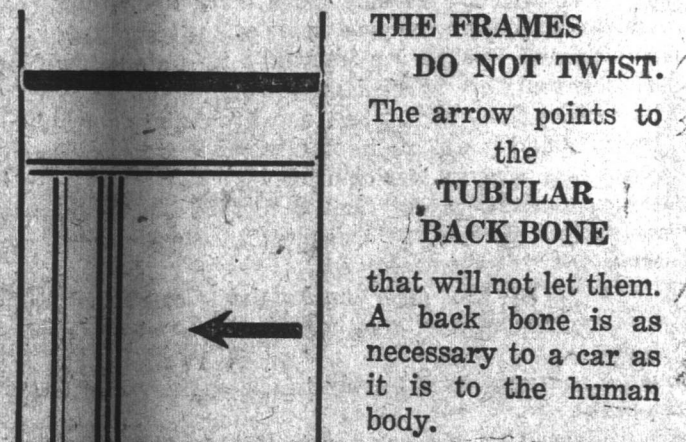

ANDER BLUFF EXPOSED

ander Project will go Through if Monroe is Elected--Promoters Ask no Concessions and Have Not Consulted Government.

The Gander Project, which the Advertiser has been boosting as part of Coaker-Hickman programme, will through if Monroe is elected.

The Telegram has received this information from the most reliable source possible, and thus, another bluff on the part of the Government has been exposed.

Neither Hickman nor Coaker have had anything to do with the conception or progress of the Gander scheme, and the credit which the Advertiser gives to the so-called Liberal Government is entirely undeserved.

The Gander proposition has been in the air for many years, and it is only now that the promoters are in a position to finalize their plans, and commence construction.

The only connection that any Government will have with the scheme will be its passage through the Legislature, a formality which attends all projects of this nature.
