ALFRED NORTON, VETERAN SADDLER CELEBRATES 85th BIRTHDAY

Orwell, April 24th.—On Wednesday, April 23, a number of the relatives of Mr. Alfred Norton, Orwell's "grand old man," assembled at his home here to join with him in the celebration of his eighty-fifth birthday.

Born in England, Mr. Norton spent the first few years of his life there, and when a lad of only thirteen was apprenticed as a saddler. In the olden days in old England it was the custom to stay with an employer seven years before you were considered to have mastered a trade. As it did with many others, the time grew irksome to Mr. Norton, and when he felt sure he had fully learned the trade, although considerably before the allotted time had expired, he booked passage for the "Land of promise, America." A sail ship was the only means of transportation in those days and some seven or eight weeks were spent on the broad expanses of the Atlantic before America was reached.

Apple and Pear Scales, Cancer, Blister Mite, Aphis, Scab, Bud-moth, Codling Moth, Chewing Insects.	1—Just before buds burst in Spring.	1—Use S 1
	2—Just before the blossoms open.	2—Use S 2.
	3—Immediately after blossoms fall. Don't wait till they all fall off.	3—Use S 2.
	4—Two weeks later.	4—Use S 2.
Plum and Cherry Scales, Aphis, Brown Rot, Slug, Circulio, Leaf, Blight, Shot Hole Fungus, Fruit Fly.	1—Just before buds burst in Spring.	1—Use S 1.
