

Important Territory in Dispute.

GEORGETOWN, British Guina, April 6. -If the Venezuelan-British Guiana boundary dispute is decided in favor of Venezuela, ninety-nine out of every hundred Englishmen in this country will lose money by it and the same may be said of nearly every American living in sul. British Guiana is divided into three counties, Demerara, Berbice and Essequibo.

Practically all the gold fields are situ ated in the Essequibo country and nearly all of the territory which comprises that country is under dispute. As the sugar industry has dwindled down to a very small factor owing to the reduction in the price of sugar, the great expense of keeping the plantations from being flooded and the difficulty of getting laborers who can stand the climate at a reasonable price, gold has become the mainstay of the colony. 
